Generative AI (GAI) can radically impact an organization's ability to fill open positions with underrepresented talent–either bringing in new talent or advancing existing talent into new roles. GAI can infuse DEI throughout the passive (developing job descriptions, creating success profiles, etc.) and active hiring processes (sourcing, screening, selecting, etc.).

This technology will codify DEI best practices and tactics rather than rely on many individuals' actions. To achieve this outcome, CDOs must lead the adoption of GAI using their own key business metrics. If CDOs lead adoption efforts, they will subsequently mitigate the bias embedded in some of these systems.
